

**Supply list for: "Playing with Paints on fabric" Mickey Lawler**  
(One day Class)

Note: Students must be able to work in a large, well-lighted room with plenty of floor space on which to dry their painted fabrics in case of inclement weather. However, sunny, outdoor space is always preferable for drying.

Each student must bring:

- a couple kitchen sponges
- about 8, total, cheap 1"- 4" natural bristle brushes and 1 or 2 sponge brushes. You will find both styles of brushes at Dollar stores, Home Depot, etc. The natural bristle brushes have the word "bristle" on the wooden handles. These should not cost more than \$.59-\$1.50 apiece.
- apron (or wear old cloths)
- plastic bags for possibility of having to take home some damp fabric
- rubber gloves (disposable doctor-type from pharmacy work best)
- 20" X 30" piece of ¼" -3/8" thick FoamCore (Staples or other office supply; also art supply stores)
- 2 to 4 yards of white 100% cotton fabric. It's not necessary to prewash fabric if drops of water sink immediately into the fabric. However, if drops of water sit on the surface, prewash fabric with detergent or choose a different fabric. No need to iron.
- a small box of straight pins
- tabletop OTT light, if possible
- permanent marking pen, scissors, paper towels
- 10-15 cottage cheese-style containers or 12 snack-size "Gladware" containers
- light-weight plastic drop cloth, cut into 15-20 pieces, approximately 2 ft. X 1.5 ft (Clear or white plastic only, please)
- plastic plant mister bottle (please make sure it "mists")
